PDK-UT Outstanding Educator 2013 Mary Jean Gallagher

Mary Jean Gallagher is an educator with a lifelong passion for improving student achievement.

She was appointed Chief Student Achievement Officer of Ontario and CEO of the Literacy and Numeracy Secretariat in September of 2008 and has leveraged this passion on a system wide level. Under her leadership, student achievement continues to rise in Ontario.

In addition to her responsibilities as Chief Student Achievement Officer, Mary Jean is the Assistant Deputy Minister of the newly formed Student Achievement Division, overseeing both elementary and secondary student success.

Before arriving at the Ministry of Education in her current roles, Mary Jean had served as Director of Education of the Greater Essex County District School Board, and its predecessor, since 1995. She was also Chair of the Council of Ontario Directors of Education and was Chief Executive Officer of the Ontario Education Improvement Commission from 1997-2000. Formerly a teacher of mathematics and computer science, as well as President of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers Federation in her district, she also served as a secondary school principal and as a School Superintendent of Staffing and Development.

Mary Jean's passion for student achievement stems from her deep seated belief in the importance of education for all children, everywhere. Her belief in community service led her to Rotary where she has been a member since 1991. In 2000 she spent a month in the Amazon Region of Brazil as a Rotary Volunteer in Action, establishing a new university in the region, with a special focus on serving the poor. In 2010, she travelled to India with Rotary and helped with a massive immunization effort which saw 172 million children vaccinated aganst polio within two days.

A former Windsor Woman of the Year, Mary Jean has also served in the city as a Director of the Arts Council, Chair of the Essex County District Health Council and Chair of the Essex County Health System Reconfiguration Project. She has been a member of the Board of Directors of United Way. Mary Jean is the recipient of the MEDA Gold Medal for Community Service, 1995, and the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal, in 2003, for her leadership in education. Early in 2005, she was presented with the Athena Award for her professionalism and community service and in June of 2006, she was bestowed an Honourary Doctor of Laws Degree from the University of Windsor.
